Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

24th March 2020

Dear Parents and Carers

After the Prime Minister's announcement yesterday, the message can't be clearer – stay at home. While the Trust continues to provide **emergency child care provision** at our seven centres listed below – unless you are a designated key worker, <u>are required to work away from your home AND have no other way to care for your child at home</u> please do not send your child to school.

Some vulnerable child may also attend school, but again consider whether this is absolutely necessary – for families with vulnerable children that do stay at home we will offer you additional support in your home and will contact you regularly.

For the safety of my staff and YOUR child – the best place is at home. Consortium staff across the Trust have shown huge compassion, grit and determination. We want to support you, will comply with the directions of the Department for Education and we will be part of the solution to this national crisis. But is it clear that social distancing and minimising contact is the best way of halting the spread of covid-19. Please help us to protect our communities, if your child can stay at home do so. I have instructed staff at the centres to refuse entry to anyone that they feel is abusing the strict rules announced by the government. Please take care, be considerate and most of all stay connected.
